

President's Message - by Doreen Rusen

In December 1993, Southern California Edison (SCE) commissioned the Los Angeles Fire Department to enter Santa Susana Mountain Park with a bulldozer for the purpose of clearing access to SCE's power lines. Although SCE had the legal right to enter the park, the damage done to the archaeological sites was, many believe, unnecessary, severe, permanent, and illegal. The California State Department Parks and Recreation brought suit against SCE. One of issues in contention is the value of the sites destroyed, and to establish that value, SSMPA's records and pertinent data were subpoensed a month ago by the attorneys for SCE. After conferring with an attorney (Frank M. Buda), we realized that it was in the association's best interest (and our legal requirement) to fully comply with their requisition. The discovery phase of the lawsuit continues, and we will know fairly soon how the State and SCE decide to resolve this issue. The State is represented by William S. Abbey, Deputy Attorney General.
